

- This SLT Chat is to keep you informed and allow you to ask questions.




Pillars of Success

Epraise = House Points and Rewards





- Pupils earn Epraise house points for excellent contributions to lessons and in our school and local community.
- Some house points are linked to our Pillars of Success.
- Each Monday, TEN pupils in Year 9 with a high Epraise score for the previous week are recognised.
- Each morning Tues Fri, TEN pupils with a high Epraise score from the previous day are celebrated.
- Epraise points can then be exchanged for rewards from our 'Epraise Shop'.
- The School Council are looking at improving this so that there is a much greater variety of rewards available from next half term onwards.
- Pupils and parents can track Epraise points via an app or the <u>online portal</u>.

Year 9 Focus and Celebration Month

- All of our pupils are respectful and lovely young people.
- Sincere praise goes a long way, and so many of our pupils are deserving of this.
- We are going to focus on praising the hundreds of young people getting it right each day through consistent/daily rewards.
- We are asking our staff to make positive contact home, either through a phone call or email.
- Successful pupils will be invited on positive reward trips such as Air Trail at Tees Barrage.
- Ensure that every child has a right to learn.





Year 9 Focus and Celebration Month

- Every child has a right to learn.
- Collaboration and discussion is an important part of learning.
- Also, your child deserves quiet time to reflect on their learning.
- Furthermore, your child deserves quiet time to be able to listen and learn in a calm, safe environment.
- We want to reassure you that, alongside the praise, we will not tolerate a small minority of pupils who are disrupting the learning of others.





Lesson Expectations and Consistency

- All teaching staff will meet and greet all pupils positively at their classroom door.
- Pupils will line up and enter the classroom respectfully and in silence and begin the learning activity whilst the teacher takes the register.
- To facilitate positive learning and mature discussion, pupils will be silent unless told otherwise by the teacher.
- Pupils will of course be allowed to communicate, debate and do group work when directed by the teacher.
- Teaching staff will issue Epraise points to recognise all the amazing work taking place and daily rewards and positive communication home will be issued in recognition of this.
- Members of staff will follow any individual support plans, and ensure the needs of all pupils are met and clearly understood.

Lesson Expectations and Consistency

- However, if a pupil is NOT following expectations, there will be a clear stepped approach.
 - RS1: A clear verbal warning will be given.
 - RS2: An RS2 will be recorded and you will be able to see this via MCAS.
 - RS3: Your child will be removed INSTANTLY and taken to our Reflection Room for 6 full lessons. The member of staff WILL ring you, the same day if possible, to discuss.
- Pupils will work in SILENCE in the Reflection Room (or an appropriate other venue if required/as per individual pupil support plan).
- If they do not follow expectations here, we will follow a similar stepped approach, and then parents will be contacted IMMEDIATELY and sanctions will be escalated accordingly.
- We reserve the right to use suspensions, according to our behaviour policy, to sanction pupils who are disturbing the learning of others.

Homework


- We are going to start gradually building up the homework that pupils receive over the next few terms.
- Homework helps pupils to consolidate their learning in class, or it may help prepare them for new learning.
- Sometimes homework helps to diversify the different topics covered and allow them to explore in more detail.
- Homework is important to develop independent learners who will be successful in Year 11 and beyond.
- Homework will look different from subject to subject.


