STEM is a broad term used to bring together the academic disciplines of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.



Exhibitors from further education establishments and the world of work highlighted the possibilities of what could be on offer to the pupils when they leave Risedale post-16 and beyond.

Every hour, a different year group of pupils (7-11) had the opportunity to move around the stalls and speak to the visitors, tasked with completing a booklet that encouraged meaningful conversations.

Ria Glenn (8 Vizor) said: "It's been fun learning about everything on offer and thinking about what we could do in the future. Everyone I spoke to was really friendly and gave me loads of great advice. It's been a brilliant day!"

Allan Guy, Technical Director of Purple Creative Studio, a digital agency based in Aske, Richmond, said "We could see that some of the pupils were a little nervous to talk with us initially, but once they relaxed, they asked us about all sorts of things such as coding and website building as well as digital marketing. We've literally spoken to hundreds of students here today and I can honestly say every single one of them has been polite and engaged; they've been a credit to the school."

Mark Kirkbride, Senior Teacher responsible for STEM at Risedale said "Having such a broad array of colleges and employers helping to promote STEM has been an amazing experience for our pupils. So many of our young people did not realise just how important these disciplines are and the opportunities available to them once they leave the Risedale Family. From speaking to the exhibitors I think they all enjoyed the day as much as our pupils did."

Aidan Mackintosh (8 Knight) said: "There were lots of stalls and opportunities to talk to people. I like the idea of a career in engineering. It's been great talking to everyone here today."

Mrs Porritt, Careers Leader said: "I would like to thank all the exhibitors for giving up their time to help support our pupils here at Risedale. Everyone had a great day finding out lots of information to help support their decision-making process when considering future career pathways and further education. It has been an amazing day, with lots of really engaging conversations."






Rock Climbing


Police Cadets News 💆

Risedale teacher's ceramics feature in Grayson's Art Club: The Exhibition







Ceramic artworks created by Risedale School's Head of Art, Ms Westwood, are now on display as part of a major national exhibition curated by contemporary artist, writer and broadcaster Grayson Perry.

<u>Grayson's Art Club: The Exhibition</u> runs from Fri 2 Dec 2022 – Sun 23 Apr 2023 at MAC (Midlands Art Centre) featuring selected works by artists, members of the general public, comedians and popular figures from the third series of Grayson Perry's <u>Art Club</u>.

Ms Westwood produced an impressive collection of 100 ceramic bonbon dishes that were selected for the Art Club television programme which aired in April 2022 on Channel 4. Ms Westwood was interviewed by Grayson online from her classroom at Risedale School where she explained what inspired her to create the bonbon dishes and some of the stories behind them > > Ms Westwood on Grayson's Art Club

Each bonbon dish is individually hand-made and decorated with text and images depicting a different memory or reflection on life in the moment of making exploring the theme 'Inside My Head'.

Ms Westwood said, "It was incredibly exciting to be part of a Channel 4 event with familiar TV faces as fellow guests – but when the gallery opened, it was seeing my own work feature so prominently in this high-profile exhibition, that led me to feel overcome with emotion and recognised as an artist! All of the exhibited work looked superb. It was such a joy to finally meet the other artists in person after only seeing them on TV and share this surreal experience. I have admired Grayson Perry for most of my professional life so it was a real privilege to be able to speak with him in person and get him to pose for the obligatory selfie of course!"

Year 10 pupil Thomas Gibbons has successfully reached his target and raised the £4,000 required to make the trip of a lifetime to the World Scout Jamboree in South Korea next year.

After 8 months of fundraising, Thomas reached his target on Tuesday 6th December when he was presented with a cheque from Jos Huddleston, President of the Rotary Club of Richmond, North Yorkshire (photo).

Commenting on Thomas' achievement, Jos said: "Thomas has shown such commitment to raise funds and prepare for this life-changing experience, and Richmond Rotary Club is delighted to support him."

Thomas is a member of Castle Explorers Scout Troop. He was the only Scout selected from the Richmondshire area and is now part of Unit 41, North Yorkshire's contingent for the 25th World Scout Jamboree in South Korea 2023.



Thomas said: "I really appreciate all the donations given to me to get out to South Korea. The anticipation of getting to Seoul and Saeangeum to experience a different continent, culture and cuisine is now real. I know this trip will be life-changing."

Thomas' Mum, Sue, said: "Thomas has been able to reach his target through the very generous donations from Richmond Rotary, Richmond Meet, The Richmond Duck Club, Colburn Town Council, The Rotary Club of Northallerton (President Mike Holmes, Risedale School Governor), Richmondshire District Scouts and so many wonderful people who gave us cash or donated via his Just Giving page. A massive thank you to each and every person who has supported Thomas!"

The £4,000 that Thomas has raised will not only pay for his own adventure to South Korea but will also contribute towards funding children from poorer countries so they attend the Jamboree as well.

Thomas will be one of 3,240 young people from the UK to join nearly 50,000 people from all over the world at the event.

Risedale School Headteacher, Colin Scott, said: "Everyone at Risedale is really proud of Thomas. Raising £4,000 is an extraordinary achievement. We can't wait to hear how he gets on at the Jamboree next year!"
