




KIT Letter Issue 20: October 2021



#### **COVID-19 Home Testing Reminder**

We know how important it is for you to be able to send your child to school so please keep encouraging them to test twice weekly, 3-4 days apart and report each result to:



- NHS Test and Trace: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result">https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result</a>
- Risedale School: <u>Home Test Result Form PUPILS</u>
- Report all positive test results to school by: As your child will be absent from school, you must report this in the normal way, contacting the school as soon as possible, making it very clear that this is because of a positive LFD test result.

PLEASE NOTE: Staff and pupils should continue to test twice-weekly over the October half-term break and preferably take an LFD test the night before they return to school. If for any reason you run out of test kits you can order more here >> Order coronavirus (COVID-19) rapid lateral flow tests or collect from your local pharmacy.

#### Risedale receives bronze award for Armed Forces Covenant Employer Recognition Scheme

#### New Wellbeing Garden at Risedale 🌱



Work began last year on a new wellbeing garden in the grounds of The Hub at Risedale, designed groundskeeper Mr Griffith and primarily funded by FutureHY, an initiative from York and York St. John Universities. 8Hill pupils jumped at the opportunity to take the lead on this project during tutor time, helping to get the process started by removing three metres of old shrubs and bushes, levelling off the ground in preparation for planters and a seating area, and planting new flowers and shrubs. The seating and planters were very kindly built and commissioned by Veterans' Woodcraft (Richmond), as part of a collaboration between the school and local stakeholders. The aim of the project was to create a calming environment where pupils who require a quiet area to relax or study can go.

Nathanael Hall enjoyed the opportunity to represent his Form and his House in this project. "I felt proud that I could represent 8Hill and Seacole House through this activity, and that the work we're doing helped to create a much-needed quiet and safe place for the pupils at Risedale School."

Form Tutor, Mr Hill, said: "It has been a real pleasure to watch our young people take such a keen interest in this project, and it has allowed them to apply the work we have been doing in tutor time surrounding the topic of mental health and personal wellbeing."

Mrs Porritt, Risedale's Service Children Advocate and Careers Leader was impressed with the attitude of the pupils involved, "They really rose to the challenge, and it was incredibly rewarding to watch them engage with the project. The project has really shown that Risedale pupils demonstrate the values of aspiration and empathy in all that they do. With phase one of the project completed, we all look forward to tackling phase two, and are absolutely convinced that once again 8Hill will demonstrate their team spirit, and rise to the challenge!"













#### Lawrence House Garden 🍸









Since returning to school in September the Lawrence House gardening team have been busy harvesting a healthy crop of potatoes, carrots, red onions and white onions; including a new record carrot of 21.5cm long. #### Post-16 and Careers Information

On Tuesday 28th September Y11 pupils from Risedale attended a taster day at Queen Elizabeth Sixth Form College. Pupils were given the chance to experience an A-Level session in 2 subjects of their choice, prior to making their college applications. All pupils enjoyed their sessions and were full of enthusiasm for the range of topics they could study from Y12 onwards, discussing what they would like to apply for. Pupils have been encouraged to attend all the local college Open Evenings to help support them in making their choices for further study Post 16.

All college applications must be completed online by the Christmas holiday, to kickstart the interview process from January 2022 onwards. Colleges will accept late entries, although there will be limited choice of courses at that stage. Darlington College will hold their interviews at the College itself conducted by their Heads of Department. Richmond Sixth Form and Queen Elizabeth Sixth Form Colleges will be holding their interviews at Risedale School.

Today we are working with both Urban and Rural communities to create a sustainable and repeatable methodology for continual community engagement on matters that concern them, such as healthy environments for play.

This month, thanks to the Risedale School leadership team, we will engage with nearly 230 bright young minds.

In conversation with the Head Teacher, Mr Colin Scott, it was obvious we share the belief that schools are the heart of the community and a desire to truly make a 'Family of Learners' that spills into all areas of the community.

Our joint mission is to support pupils in generating high-quality data to support evidence and ideas that will be shared with the school and the community to create a basis for conversation with the relevant government bodies and promote ACTION and measurable IMPACT!

#### The Workshops

These will involve pupils using design thinking methodology to reflect upon their local area, its infrastructure and amenities and how they feel about living there. It will take on board their fears and concerns and help them to use an interactive tool where they can record positive and challenging attributes of the local area. This workshop is an introduction to becoming a global citizen and about taking ownership and finding their voice for change.

We have competitions which will run in conjunction with the workshops and will have prizes which help to encourage social mobility by 7 Gen Analytics teaming up with universities and businesses.
