Snow Closures 38





As the winter progresses, we can expect a heavy snowfall at any time. While we make every effort to keep the school open, there may be times when we have to close, either for a full day or during the day.

We understand that the majority of our pupils live within walking distance of Risedale and can get to school in most circumstances. However, many of our staff team live further

afield and have difficulty getting in during heavy snow, occasionally making it difficult to maintain our pupil to staff ratios. There are a number of other health and safety issues we need to consider to ensure the safety of everyone while they are in school.

In the event of snow, please note the following:

- Risedale School will open in the first instance.
- Check your text messages we will let you know if school is going to be closed for the day as early as we can. We will also let you know if school closes during the day

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by text. If you do not receive school text messages, please let the office have your mobile number.

• Please do not telephone the school - we try to keep these lines open so that staff can contact us to let us know their situation. If the school closes during the day, staff that live near to school will stay with children who cannot be picked up quickly; please travel safely on these occasions and remember the children will be in good hands.

Remote learning expectations for snow days:



If we do announce a snow day closure your child will be set work via Google Classroom for the timetabled lessons they have that day. As with other remote learning times we recommend, as far as possible, that your child sticks to the routine of the school day.

COVID-19 in-school testing - January 2022

As per current government guidelines, Risedale School will be offering one Lateral Flow Device (LFD) test on-site at the beginning of the Spring Term in January. We plan to test pupils in





Years 7, 8, and 11 on Tuesday 4th January (Training Day) and Years 9 and 10 on Wednesday 5th January.

All parents/carers must read 'Planned COVID testing in-school for January 2022' to find out all the details and timings that your child will need for their allotted testing day.

COVID-19 at-home testing - REMINDER

We know how important it is for you to be able to send your child to school so please keep encouraging them to test twice weekly, 3-4 days apart, and report each result to:

- NHS Test and Trace: https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result
- Risedale School: <u>Home Test Result Form PUPILS</u>
- Report all positive test results to school: As your child will be absent from school, you must report this in the normal way, contacting the school as

soon as possible, making it very clear that this is because of a positive LFD test result.



PLEASE NOTE: Staff and pupils should continue to test twice-weekly over the Christmas Holiday. If for any reason you run out of test kits you can order more here >> Order coronavirus (COVID-19) rapid lateral flow tests or collect from your local pharmacy.



Contact tracing and self-isolation

On Tuesday 14 December a new national approach to daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 was introduced. All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, who are identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should now take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day, for 7 days, instead of self-isolating. Daily testing by close contacts will help to slow the spread of COVID-19. NYCC - Home to School Transport Policy

North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC) has asked us to share the following message with all parents as this information will be particularly relevant for those with pre-school siblings, or those due to transfer to the Secondary phase in the future. NYCC will send a further reminder on this before the start of the next admissions round for entry in September 2023:

"We write to remind schools and parents of the following information in relation to the LA's Home to School Transport Policy which we suggest parents should take into account when deciding which schools to nominate as their preferred place for Reception and Y7.

With effect from September 2019, the LA's Home to School Transport Policy changed to offer transport to pupils attending their catchment or nearest school (rather than nearer) providing the walking distance is over 2 miles (until the end of the school year in which a pupil turns 8) or over 3 miles (if aged 8 and over). Pupils whose transport was set up under the previous policy (to the catchment or nearer school) will continue to receive that service until the end of their primary or secondary education unless they change address or move schools.

Please note that the nearest school could mean an out-of-county school or a faith school as these are included when determining transport eligibility. The address used to obtain a school place is the address used to determine transport eligibility. Reassessments are made following a change of address."

Swimming success at national championships for Thomas Leighton Thomas Leighton (7Vizor) wins bronze at national swimming championships.

Dedicated swimmer Thomas Leighton had a very successful weekend at the Swim England North East Regional swimming championships at Ponds Forge International Sports Centre, Sheffield.

Thomas qualified for 10 different events at the championships and competed in 7 of them. He achieved personal bests in 6 out of the 7 events and his highest accolade was winning the bronze medal in the 11yr old boys 50m backstroke.

Coach Keith Hall of Richmond Dales Amateur Swimming Club said, "To put this into perspective, this is the highest level of domestic competition that a swimmer of Thomas' age can reach as the English and British Championships are only open to older swimmers."



"As a competitive swimming club we aim to allow our swimmers to compete at the highest level they can in their sport and Thomas is a very talented swimmer."

He added, "This is a very significant achievement for Thomas and as a club, we are extremely proud of him, not only for his performance at this event but for his commitment, attitude and dedication to his sport. Thomas is maturing into a dedicated athlete and we are very excited for his future in swimming. He is a credit to his family, himself and the school."

Thomas has been swimming for Richmond Dales Amateur Swimming Club for 3 years. He trains up to 5 times a week with training sessions often lasting up to 2 hours. Thomas said:



"When I started swimming it was really just as a hobby but now I'm getting to a higher level it's really made me determined to do well and try my very best. I absolutely love swimming and can't wait to represent my club and the school at the next big competition."

Head of PE Miss Brierley said, "We are all so proud of Thomas. His dedication to swimming is really something to be admired and commended. At Risedale one of our school aims is to 'Build resilience, accept challenge and strive for excellence' and Thomas is a wonderful example of this. Congratulations Thomas!"

Thomas receives prestigious environmental award
Thomas Gibbons (9Southworth-Gedye) has been recognised for his outstanding work
and contribution to conservation and the environment.

At a recent awards ceremony, Thomas' hard work and dedication were justly rewarded when he received the Conserver Award, the highest accreditation possible within the <u>John Muir Award</u> programme.

The John Muir Trust is a community-focused conservation charity dedicated to the experience, protection and repair of wild places across the UK. The award itself encourages people of all backgrounds to connect with, enjoy and care for wild places.

To achieve the Conserver Award Thomas had to complete 20 days/125+ hours working and supporting projects in the Dales National Park over a minimum of six months.

Thomas said: "I was so pleased to receive the award. It was hard work but really enjoyable. I love anything to do with protecting the environment and getting involved with green projects in my local area."





Thomas is a Dales Young Ranger and a member of the Youth Environment Forum, run by the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust, part of Green Futures.



Rosie Russell-Cohen, Youth and Communities Officer for the Yorkshire Dales Millenium Trust said: "As a key member of the Youth Forum, Thomas is part of the select group that helps plan environmental events, raise awareness about environmental issues and makes decisions about what the project does and how it is run."

Thomas' Form Tutor and Head of Drama Mrs Southworth-Gedye said, "We're all really proud of Thomas here at school. It's humbling to hear how dedicated Thomas is to his role as a Young Ranger and the time he dedicates to our local area is inspirational. I'm sure that Thomas will be a great advocate for conservation and ecology for many years to come."

As part of the presentation, Thomas received a certificate and personal letter from David Butterworth, Chief Executive of the Yorkshire Dales National Park (Yoredale) commending his efforts.
