


Attendance, Absence and Punctuality

Good attendance is the key to school success. There is a proven link between this and strong GCSE/KS4 outcomes. Nationally, pupils with 95-100% attendance were 2.4 times more likely to achieve at least a strong pass (grade 5) in English and Maths at GCSE than pupils with 85-90% attendance. In addition, pupils who attend regularly benefit from the connections and relationships school provides, and the social/emotional learning opportunities.

We ask for your support in ensuring your child is in school on time every day (by 8.20 am), unless they are too ill to function in school. Building good habits and expectations around school attendance is crucial from Year 7 (and ideally these should be fostered at primary school).

Self-Identification of Service Families – A Crucial Request

At Risedale, we understand the unique and distinct challenges facing military pupils and their families. We are passionate about meeting our service pupils' academic and pastoral needs so they are not educationally disadvantaged.

To provide the flexible, tailored support our service pupils deserve, we ask families to inform us at the earliest opportunity if your child is a service pupil.

Early identification allows us to:

- Offer tailored pastoral support, particularly during times of family separation, including deployments.
- Better understand pupil needs and help mitigate the potential impact of mobility on their education.
- Create an inclusive, supportive environment where our service pupils are celebrated.

We ask you to identify your child if they have:

- One or more parents/carers serving in the regular armed forces (including full-time reserve service or armed forces of another nation stationed in England).
- Been recorded as a 'Service child' in any school census in the past 6 years.
- A parent/guardian who is a veteran who has served at any point in the child's life.
- A pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme or the War Pensions Scheme.
