Risedale School Celebrates Pupils' GCSE Achievements



Pupils at Risedale School celebrated a significant milestone on Thursday, 21st August, as they collected their GCSE grades. The atmosphere was one of celebration and relief, marking the end of a chapter filled with hard work and dedication.

Mrs Greenwood, who took up her post as the school's new Headteacher last September, expressed how proud she was of Year 11 pupils for the way they approached the examinations in the summer and the commitment to hard work evident in the results. "This year, we have seen a marked improvement in the number of pupils leaving Risedale with passes in the facilitating qualifications of Maths and English. This means more of our pupils will be able to easily access their chosen post-16 pathways and go on to make a real difference. I am proud of the way this

year group has embraced the positive changes we have introduced in school over the last 12 months, and many of them have tackled their GCSEs and alternative qualifications with incredible energy and enthusiasm, even when they have faced challenges, such as attending multiple schools due to parents having important roles in the military."

Among the year group, there were many notable successes.

top grades in Geography and History, as well as a range of other subjects. Her kindness and warmth shone in all she did, and this, as well as her dedication to learning, will ensure she has a bright future.

Nathanael Hall brought zest and energy to his studies, being an incredibly articulate pupil. He performed strongly across all his subjects, including notable success in Physics, Engineering and GCSE PE.

Tallulah-Grace Tomlinson is a mature and dedicated pupil, who teachers describe as 'a delight to teach'. She was justly rewarded with high grades in Religious Studies and Design and Technology, and is absolutely delighted to have achieved grade 8s in both English qualifications.

Tyler Cassidy [PHOTO RIGHT] worked exceptionally hard across all avenues of school life, and combined academic prowess with exceptional skill on the piano, with the ability to memorise entire pieces by heart. He



achieved top grades in English, Mathematics, Science and Media Studies alongside a strong GCSE in Music.

Kalob McLoughlin is a thoughtful and considered pupil who was justly rewarded with a grade 8 in Geography and grade 7s in Science, Engineering and English, with further strong passes in other subjects.

"Flying is the best experience you can have at this age. The whole process, from the briefing to taking the controls, was incredible. If you manage to get the

chance, it would truly be the best thing you've ever done; it was amazing. I absolutely love being part of the Air Cadets."

Oscar Baker (9Conway)

"It was great. First, we were briefed on what to do and what not to do when we got in the plane. Very quickly, my time came to fly, and it was the best experience ever. I was first taught to do some ups and downs and lefts and rights, which were great. But the real fun thing was that before we landed, we got to do some acrobatics! First, we did a barrel roll, which was super dizzy. After that, we did a stall turn—basically, we went straight up, nudged the controls left, and then turned and started going back down. But what really was the best thing we did was a loop-the-loop, and let's just say it was amazing. We pulled



up to five to six Gs, and it's just better than most of the theme park rides you'll go on in a lifetime. It's hard to explain just how unbelievable the whole experience was—it was FANTASTIC!"

A big thank you goes to today's captain, Leah Metcalfe (7Shephard), who led the girls with outstanding positivity and encouragement.



Restart A Heart Day

Year 7 Pupils Become Lifesavers on Restart a Heart Day!



Risedale School proudly participated in Restart a Heart Day on Thursday, 16th October, with its newest cohort of Year 7 pupils undertaking vital CPR training. This engaging and empowering annual event, delivered in partnership with the Yorkshire Ambulance Service, equipped young people with the essential skills to save a life.

Every year, Risedale School commits to ensuring its Year 7 pupils receive comprehensive CPR instruction, fostering a community of confident and capable potential lifesavers. This year was no exception, as pupils enthusiastically engaged in hands-on sessions led by dedicated off-duty staff and volunteers from the Yorkshire Ambulance Service.



The importance of early CPR cannot be overstated. A cardiac arrest patient's chance of survival dramatically increases if CPR can begin before the ambulance service arrives on scene. Initiatives like Restart a Heart Day are crucial in spreading this life-saving knowledge far and wide. This year alone, Yorkshire Ambulance off-duty staff and volunteers taught CPR to more than 40,000 pupils at secondary schools across Yorkshire, marking 12 years of this incredible campaign.

Ms Dunphy, Head of Social Studies, shared her thoughts on the day: "We are incredibly proud of our Year 7 pupils for embracing this vital training. Seeing their dedication and understanding of how to perform CPR gives them a critical skill that could one

day make all the difference. It's empowering for them, and reassuring for our community, to know they have this knowledge."

The training provided Risedale's Year 7 pupils with practical experience in chest compressions and rescue breaths, teaching them how to recognise a cardiac arrest and respond effectively in an emergency. The day was not only educational but also instilled a sense of responsibility and confidence in our young learners.
