Uniform Expectations

We absolutely appreciate that the uniform expectations have had to be relaxed during the last term due to keeping windows open for proper ventilation. We also accept that it has been more challenging for parents/carers to replace outgrown uniform/shoes during the most recent lockdown. However, as we move into the warmer months and as the shops start to open again, staff have started to remind pupils of the expectations. There will be a big push on this after Easter especially, but staff have started to make those reminders now.



To support us with this, please encourage your child to be properly dressed in their uniform, ready for school after the holiday.

- **Shoes:** Footwear is becoming an issue and a high number of pupils do actually have their school shoes in their bags but are choosing not to wear them. Please remind them of this focus.
- **Blazers/jumpers/coats:** Blazers must be worn at all times. Plain black jumpers are allowed under blazers but hoodies are not allowed at all. Coats are still recommended as it can be cool at break and lunch time but must not be worn in place of blazers.
- **Hoodies:** Please encourage your child to leave their hoodie at home for out of school use. Hoodies are not part of the school uniform.
- Jewellery/piercings: Please remind your child that jewellery and piercings are not allowed.

Home Testing over the Easter holiday

It is important for pupils and staff to **keep testing through the Easter holidays** to manage the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19), as part of a regular habit of testing at home every 3-4 days (twice a week). NHS Test and Trace have supplied sufficient test kits to enable this to happen and these are being distributed to our pupils and staff this week.

Please continue reporting all test results to the \underline{NHS} and the <u>school</u>.





Testing for parents, households and bubbles twice a week

Regular rapid testing is now also available for parents, their households and support or childcare bubbles. The government is encouraging all families to participate in twice weekly testing to help stop the spread of coronavirus.



Parents and other adults in a household can access tests by:

- Ordering tests online <u>www.gov.uk/order-school-household-tests</u>.
- Getting an assisted test at work, if it is available.
- Attending a test site to get tested (where you will be able to see how to take the test) or pick up tests to do at home.

National Tutoring Programme

After Easter we start our new 1 to 1 and small group online tutoring programme. We are very excited to be joining up with MyTutor, a well-established national provider to support over 50 of our Year 10 pupils.

NyTutor Parents of those pupils will be contacted this week and the tutoring programme begins in the week commencing 19th April.

The aim of the programme is to ensure that all pupils make the progress they need and no pupil is left behind. This is only the first step of our provision to support pupils who have struggled during lockdown. Keep an eye open for more announcements in the summer term.

Y10 and 11 - please return borrowed Chromebooks

If your child borrowed a Chromebook from school during lockdown please let them know that they will have to return this device after the Easter holiday. It is essential that these Chromebooks are returned as they are the devices that will need to be used for the Y10 MyTutor programme (see above).



As previously mentioned, we are purchasing more devices and by September 2021 every child should have their own Chromebook, but for now we do need to share the devices we have available. Thank you for your understanding as we secure more funding so every child can benefit from the Chromebook project.



Parent/Carer Drop-in Sessions with our School Counsellor



Hi, I'm Lisa, the new School Counsellor. My job is to support our pupils here at Risedale, and if possible, to also support you as parents and carers with any concerns you may have about your child's general mental health and wellbeing. I would ideally like to offer this service via a face-to-face drop-in session, but unfortunately due to COVID this isn't currently possible. So for now, as an alternative, I would like to offer telephone appointments until we can meet in person.
