

Updated GCSE Headline Results for 2017

We would like to thank the students and teachers for their hard work throughout the school. All the efforts combined has led to a further significant increase in results, most notably in the core subjects of English and mathematics.

In English 70% of students achieved a grade 4 or more, up from 48% the previous year and significantly above the national average. We are also delighted that 54% of students achieved a grade 5 or more in English which is the equivalent of securing a strong grade C. This was a very strong result for the school.

In mathematics 62% of students achieved a grade 4 or more, up from 50% last year. A highly commendable increase. 36% of students also achieved a grade 5 or more and we look forward to this rising further for the current GCSE cohort.

We are also offering increasing number of students the chance of achieving the full set of eBacc qualifications and we are delighted that over 25% of students who entered the full eBacc suite achieved a grade C or higher in each of English, Mathematics, two sciences, humanities and a modern foreign language. 19% of the cohort were entered for this qualification and this rises to 24% for our current GCSE students.

The average total P8 was -0.1, up significantly from -0.3 the previous year. This puts the school, across all subjects, approximately in line with the national average and demonstrates an overall average increase across all subjects within the school.
