fter a busy Summer performing across England, Scotland, and Wales, British Army Band Catterick travelled to Stonyhurst College in Clitheroe for a recruitment event with the National Youth Brass Band of Great Britain (NYBBGB). This was our most important recruiting event of the year, as NYBBGB is the UK's leading brass band charity. Their ensembles are made up of some of the brightest young brass and percussion players in the country, so we knew we had to impress.

First on the agenda for our week with NYBBGB was a concert. We performed to hundreds of children, their tutors and educationalists, showcasing some of our finest soloists. Sgt Del Gaudio O'Brien and LCpl Innes performed the well-loved tune, Under the Boardwalk, complete with band choreography. We also premiered a composition written by LCpl Marston, our resident Soprano Cornet player, called Introducing. Throughout the concert, the Director of Music and Bandmaster compèred the varied programme, and talked about what a career in British Army Music can offer.

We then performed a marching display on the scenic grounds of Stonyhurst College. Music included Superman, Gladiator, Avengers, a



well-known brass band piece called Starburst, and various marches. The audience seemed to thoroughly enjoy this performance.

The next activity we hosted was nothing to do with music, and the children seemed to love it! We split down the hundreds of attendees into small groups, and set them to work on various team-building tasks. We related these command tasks to real-life situations that

someone may find themselves in when serving in the British Army. The children received these activities really well and it seemed to break the ice between them and our recruitment team. The final part of the event was a Question and Answer session with the Bandmaster.

We undertake various events like this throughout the year, with schools and music centres, and look forward to doing more in 2024 and 2025.



PARAS' 10 CATTERICK 2024 – 3 MEDICAL REGIMENT TEAM

n 28 Sep 24, over 600 military and civilian personnel gathered on the edge of Catterick Training Area (CTA). In unusually good weather for Catterick, the sun shone down – however the nearby trenches remained deep with water following heavy rain in the days before. Some wearing daysacks and boots, others in running kit, they listened in to OC Pegasus Company over the tannoy. Designed to replicate the 10 miles between the Drop Zone (DZ) and the Objective, the 10 mile route of P Company test week is regarded as one of the ultimate 10 mile endurance races.

Carrying 35lbs and wearing boots, the 10 mile TAB is unlike most other races out there. With preparation and training starting months prior, 3 Medical Regiment submitted a team of 9 people to take on the challenge. Across ranks and abilities, we gathered on the start line. Supported by Digger (an ex Military Working Dog) belonging to Capt Jessop – we stepped off to the sound of blank fire provided by the Parachute Regiment Association.

Undulating, challenging terrain lay ahead. From a mile-long stretch of steady climb at around the 3-mile point, the sun beat down on us. Welcome shade came at fishpond lake, where you could see the leaders coming out the end of the loop just as we entered.

2Lt Tutt and I where neck and neck for the first 5 miles, his presence noted by many along the route due to the loud-clanging of the gym plates in his bergen. I got to around 7 miles where

I bumped into Lt Simpson – powering ahead like it was a walk (well run) in the park. Digger was also very popular along the route, even featuring on the event Instagram page on the day.



The Land of Nod.

As we approached what we thought was the end, the infamous 'Land of Nod' lay ahead. Originally mentioned in the book of Genesis, the Land of Nod is now known by all those who have stepped on CTA as some of the most brutal hill reps possible. A steep assent of rock, we felt the weight of our bergans deep into our quads and calves.

Met by a rather sadistic photographer at the top, we continued on a welcome downhill towards the water trenches. Initially cooling on the hot day, the muddy water then quickly filled our boots. At some points thigh-deep in deep brown water, we treaded carefully to avoid ending up like the vicar of Dibley.

The final uphill mile was a challenge in our water logged boots, but we powered through.

With myself and Lt Timpson getting under the Ihr50 'pass' mark of P Company test week, we passed the finish line to receive a medal from Parachute Regiment veterans in their maroon lids.

Although a great personal test of fitness, the main effort of the PARAS' 10 race is that of charity; in support of SUPPORT OUR PARAS. With out entry fees kindly subsidised by Col Harold, Commander Med 1 UK XX, we felt that we had not only pushed ourselves to the physical limits but also supported an incredible charity who do some amazing work for Parachute Regiment veterans and their families.

A thoroughly enjoyable (at points, Type 2 fun) day was had by all. After a much needed shower, we gathered in the nearby Holly Hill Inn for a well deserved lunch to refuel. Again kindly supported by Col Harold, the lunch was a great opportunity to reflect on each others' experience of the day — sharing dits of funny moments, parts we found challenging and coming together across ranks in a much needed informal setting after the ever busy battle-rhythm of regiment.

BLUF: ASBM&HD supported The Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo Pipes & Drums on their deployment to Germany.

WHEN – 18-22 August 24

WHERE - Dusseldorf, Federal Republic of Germany.

WHO - Attended by NATO partners and senior defence officials from Germany, Switzerland, Singapore, and Jordan. Audience of 11000 and broadcast on German national TV.

WHAT – Overseas Military Tattoo, most similar to the Royal Marines' Mountbatten Festival of Music.

WHY - The Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo (REMT) has sent a group of pipers, drummers, dancers and fiddle players to the Musikfest Der Bundeswehr for the last 3 years. The Director of Army Bagpipe Music and Senior Pipe Major are contracted to REMT for their home event in August and learnt that several of REMT's most capable pipers were not able to support the tattoo's deployment to Germany. The intent was to enhance the working relationship between the Royal

Edinburgh Military Tattoo and ASBM&HD. Giving up personal time to participate in the event and wearing REMT uniform was greatly appreciated.

REMT are a crucial partner to the Army's Pipes and Drums. They provide 100% of the funding for the Army Piping and Drumming Championships, the Midlothian Schools Project, and give the Army an unparalleled CE and DE platform.

WHAT – Cutlers Sword.

General - On September 18, 2024, the prestigious Cutlers Sword competition unfolded in Warminster, featuring eight talented competitors. This annual event aims to crown the top drummer or bugler in the British Army. This year's competition introduced a slight modification by incorporating a fitness and DCCT segment,

providing a comprehensive assessment of the participants' mental and physical capabilities. It was inspiring to witness the enthusiasm and participation this year, but ultimately, only one could emerge victorious. The title was awarded to LSgt Mills, who excelled in every event and delivered a remarkable performance on his Bb flute. Additionally, LSgt Walker secured third place, showcasing his impressive skills as well.

WHY - The competition is held by the Colonel of Infantry annually to identify the young Regular drummer or bugler who has individually contributed most during the calendar year. He must have shown unusual and exemplary ability and initiative as a drums/bugles musician while performing to the highest standards as an infantry soldier. Originally devised to inspire

and bring on potential senior Drum Majors in the Foot Guards and English and Welsh Line, the competition was extended to bring in the Light Division and Bugle Majors of the future as well. Entry is by Commanding Officer's citation called for in the spring in respect of the previous year. The winner is chosen in the early summer, and he receives his prize, a Drummers Sword (Gilt Fittings) or a Buglers Sword (polished Nickel fittings) as appropriate in November. The sword is uniquely engraved with the winner's name, Regiment and the date, and is thus of some value. The presentation takes place during the Lord Mayor's Show outside the Mansion House in the City of London and the sword generously provided each year by the Worshipful Company of Cutlers, is presented in person by the new Lord Mayor.

WHAT – A Hook Coy storeroom has been transformed into a Welfare Facility for Functional Skills recruits. The QM's Team organised redecoration, furniture, new electric sockets and flooring and the CO provided funding to purchase welfare equipment.

WHY – Hook Coy manage approx. 200 recruits per year through a 4-week Functional Skills package, predominantly facilitated by civilian educators. The Coy provides the RLS for the recruits and also breaks up the Functional Skills package with a mixture of military training and welfare. With no central meeting room in the accommodation and with welfare opportunities limited, it was thought that a bespoke welfare facility within the Lines would improve cohesion and morale as well as providing recruits the chance to watch the

UK News etc to enhance their understanding of English. The only suitable location available was an old storeroom, but once the decision was taken in Feb to turn the store into a welfare room the Hook Coy team worked with the QM Department to produce a facility where recruits can meet up and relax. So far, the room has been a resounding success and used by recruits to watch videos, be updated on current affairs and for religious meetings. The room is still work in progress and the team will continue to add to the facilities.

WHAT – The Tiree Ultra Marathon consists of running off road trails, beaches and hill passes


to complete a full circumnavigation of the island covering 35 miles.
