Uniform and Personal Property Reminders

- Blazers/jumpers/coats: Blazers must be worn at all times. Plain black jumpers are allowed under blazers but hoodies are not allowed at all. Any hoodie that is brought into school will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day. Outdoor coats can be worn at break and lunchtime but must not be worn in place of blazers, and must be over the blazer.
- **Trousers:** Leggings are becoming an issue and are not allowed to be worn as part of the school uniform. Jeggings and skinny-leg trousers are also not allowed. Trousers must be smart, plain black and long. No denim material.
- **Shoes:** Footwear is becoming an issue and a high number of pupils do actually have their school shoes in their bags but are choosing not to wear them. Please remind your child of this focus.
- **Jewellery/piercings:** No jewellery except a watch. One small pair of sleepers/studs may be worn in ears but no other piercings of any kind are permitted.
- **Mobile phones:** The use of mobile phones in school is prohibited. This is to avoid them being used by pupils to inappropriately access social media or for some other distraction to learning. For safeguarding reasons pupils need to let staff know if there are issues so that we can contact parents directly with information about what is being done. As all pupils have been issued with a Chromebook for any online learning, mobile phones in school are unnecessary.
- **Headphones:** If pupils are seen wearing headphones around school they are likely to be listening to music which is a distraction from learning. Therefore, as with mobile phones, headphones are not needed or permitted in school **and will be confiscated and returned at the end of the day.**
- Vapes: Risedale is a smoke-free workplace/school. Pupils MUST NOT bring Vapes into the school premises. Vapes will be confiscated and parents contacted, to pick up if required.
- **Chewing gum:** Pupils must NOT chew gum on the school site. An instant RS2 will be issued to any pupil caught chewing gum.



Exam Invigilators / Readers

Risedale is looking for highly motivated and enthusiastic individuals to fulfil the important role of Exam Invigilator/Reader. The role requires supporting our pupils for examinations throughout the school year, but particularly in December, January, May and June, and also March this year. Duties include supervising pupils taking examinations, preparing exam rooms, distributing and collecting exam papers and facilitating access arrangements e.g. acting as a reader, if required. We are looking for people who are organised, vigilant and reliable, have good attention to detail and excellent communication skills. We are a friendly team and full training will be provided.

Work is on an ad hoc basis according to need and availability and takes place within the normal school day. As the work is part-time, we can usually be flexible and fit in with days/times to suit other commitments you may have.

Typically applicants could be working in the region of 90 hours per year paid monthly on an hourly claiming basis of £10.21 per hour, with scope for additional hours.



COVID-19 at-home testing - REMINDER

We know how important it is for you to be able to send your child to school, so please keep encouraging them to test twice weekly, 3-4 days apart, and report each result to:

- NHS Test and Trace: https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result
- Risedale School: <u>Home Test Result Form PUPILS</u>
- Report all positive test results to school: As your child will be absent from school, you must report this in the normal way, contacting the school as soon as possible, making it very clear that this is because of a positive LFD test result.



Information for parents of pupils aged 5 to 17 years old on the vaccination programme from the Government

Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions. Being vaccinated minimises the need for children and young people to have time

off from school or college, and helps them to continue to carry out their hobbies, attend social events and live their lives to the full.

The Government has published some <u>frequently asked questions</u> (FAQs) on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19.

Guidance on how to <u>book appointments</u> for children aged 12 years and over is available on the NHS website. Further information on the vaccination of high-risk children aged 5 to 11 years old is available in the <u>guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years</u> published by the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA)."


House Step Count Competition

County Cross Country Championships


On Saturday 15th January, Risedale School hosted the North Yorkshire Schools County Cross Country Championships at the Jaffa sports fields.

from time to time along their journey and find support, rest and practical help.


